

BOOK PROJECTS

CEREAL BOX PROJECT OPTION



After reading a book of their choice, students are asked to secure a cereal box and decorate it to showcase specific elements of their book.

DIRECTIONS FOR THE OUTSIDE OF YOUR BOX:

Students should be sure to include the following on the sides of the box:

Front:

- Book title and author/illustrator name
- Student's name
- Genre (fiction/nonfiction)
- Picture of the main character/subject

Sides:

Provide details about the main character/subject (choose one or more of the following):

- Use a word, sentence or paragraph that describes the character physically. Please use your judgement as what should be the requirement of your student.
- Describe the character's/subject's personality using appropriate proof from the text (For example, Jane is kind because she helps the kitten find his way home at the end of the story.)

Back:

Provide details about your favorite part (choose one or more of the following)

- Draw a picture of a favorite scene/event
- Use a word, sentence or paragraph that describes a favorite scene/event. Please use your judgement as what should be the requirement of your student.

Bottom:

Exciting Vocabulary Word Jar

- Pick at least 3 "WOW" words from your story that you would like to share with your classmates.

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WANTED POSTER

DIRECTIONS:

Students will take a poster board and design it to display the main character/subject from their book.

Requirements:

- Write the title, author's name and your name
- Provide details about the main character:
 - Write: Wanted and then your main character/subject's name
 - Draw a picture of him/her/it
 - Use a word, sentence or paragraph that describes the character/subject. Please use your judgement as what should be the requirement of your student.
 - Describe why that character is "Wanted". Is it for kindness or for bravery? Is it because they invented something amazing? Draw, cut out or print pictures, or write a paragraph that explains why your character is on this "Wanted" poster.



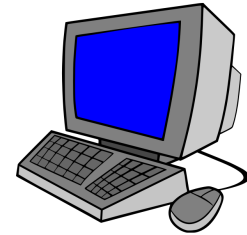
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MULTIMEDIA PROJECT OPTION

- Main character and description
- Setting
- Identify the conflict/problem and solution if applicable
- Summary

FOR NONFICTION BOOKS:

- Title, author, your name
- Subject
- Main idea and at least 3 supporting details
- Summary
- Would you recommend this book and why?
